## Height and Weight Checks



All parents/carers with children in Reception class – Year 6 should have received a letter regarding their child's height and weight measurement check.

Every year in England the children in Reception to Year 6 have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme, this information then helps build an understanding of how children are growing, so that the best possible advice and support can be provided for them and their families.

The staff from the School Health Service will be in school on Thursday **9<sup>th</sup> November 2017** to measure your child. After your child has been measured, you will receive a letter from CHAMP with your child's unique reference number. You will then be able to access and view their results at

If you have opted out of the check then your child will **NOT** need to participate.
